## Torres Strait Islander cultural presentations - Eddie Peters

**Sun 4<sup>th</sup> July - 12:00pm**

**Mon 5<sup>th</sup> – Thurs 8<sup>th</sup> July - 11:00am & 1:00pm**

Workshops will be presented by Torres Strait Islander musician and dancer Eddie Peters. Comprising of cultural information, story, songs and dance, Eddie's sessions include teaching his audience movements for certain dances, and a Torres Strait Islander song. Approximately 45 minutes per session.

General information about the yidaki (didjeridu) is included in these presentations related to protocols, ceremonial, contemporary practices, techniques, sounds etc, with an extended performance of yidaki .

## **Mon 5<sup>th</sup> July: First Australians – The Untold Story**

### **2:00pm: Episode 1 - *THEY HAVE COME TO STAY* – Sydney & NSW – 1788 - 1824**

*The First Australians and the powerful British Empire come face to face. Friendships quickly form despite immense differences, but within three years they are locked in a battle for land and survival.*

### **3:00pm: Episode 2 - *HER WILL TO SURVIVE* – Tasmania – 1803 - 1880**

*It is a myth that the First Australians were eradicated in Tasmania. It should be their resilience, in spite of the overwhelming impact of white settlement, which is embodied in myth.*

## **Tues 6<sup>th</sup> July: First Australians – The Untold Story**

### **2:00pm: Episode 3 – *FREEDOM FOR OUR LIFETIME* – Victoria - 1860 - 1890**

*Aboriginal reserves could have become places where First Australians prospered, then proudly carried their differences into the world outside, but paternalism, politics and power struggles lead to the opportunity being lost.*

### **3:00pm: Episode 4 - *NO OTHER LAW* – Central Australia - 1878 - 1897**

*Many individuals had a profound effect on the First Australians. When the authorities turn a blind eye to evil intent, because it serves their purpose, someone has to take a stand.*

## **Wed 7<sup>th</sup> July: First Australians – The Untold Story**

### **2:00pm: Episode 5 – *AN UNHEALTHY GOVERNMENT EXPERIMENT* – Western Australia - 1897 - 1937**

*Many First Australians are being born into hybrid lives, strictly controlled by white society. It is hard for them to find their feet in the new world or the old, but their spirits endure.*

### **3:00pm: Episode 6 - *A FAIR GO FOR A DARK RACE* – South Eastern Australia - 1937 - 1967**

*A mass political movement helped win national citizenship rights in 1967, but it was built on successive, strategic campaigns conducted by the First Australians from the 1930s*

## **Thurs 8<sup>th</sup> July: First Australians – The Untold Story**

### **2:00pm: Episode 7 – *WE ARE NO LONGER SHADOWS* – Queensland and the Torres Strait Islands – 1967 - 1992**

*Losing control of the land had the most devastating impact on the First Australians. The struggle for land rights continues to this day, and one of its heroes is Eddie Koiki Mabo.*

*This episode features the life and work of Eddie Mabo whose historic battle in the High Court of Australia overturned terra nullius, and led the way for Native Title and the recognition of prior ownership.*
